captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. 24 Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death?

I am not trying to discourage you from making and keeping your resolutions. I am warning you that they can be an opportunity for the evil one to try to make you feel depressed, stresses and hopeless.

We need to remember that our ultimate hope does not lie in our getting our act together. Our hope is in the one who from the beginning of time has been working to show you that you are loved.

This past half year in confirmation class we have been studying how God like a lover has been pursuing his beloved. That would be us. We are God's beloved.

I want to briefly review some events in what is called salvation history that lead up to the birth we just celebrated. History shows us that we have made mistakes. But it also shows us that God doesn't abandon us when we fail.

Creation pix: We begin at the beginning as God created the heavens and the earth, all that is, God created.

Then very quickly, at least as God tells us through the bible, what God created good, quickly turn away from good in what we call the fall.

Fall pix: Adam and Eve lived in paradise, in fellowship with God but they weren't satisfied letting God be God. They wanted to be their own god; they wanted to decide their own destiny. Pix

God wasn't satisfied with the way things were going but won't abandon his creation. Noah's ark pix: So he tried to cleanse his creation through the flood, starting over with Noah and his family. Maybe this where we get the idea for a New Year's resolution. Noah and his family would try to do better.

Well that didn't go so well, so God came up with another idea. A new plan, a new covenant, we call it the old testament. God choose those we called in Confirmation, people of the promise, Abraham and Sarah.

Pix: God told them to start over, take a new fresh start, leave your homeland and family. Trust me God said to this old couple, I promise to make you a great nation, I will give you a promised land and most of all I will always be with you.

The promised passed on to Abraham and Sarah's son Isaac and Rebecca, then to Jacob and Rachel.

Pix: Jacob had 12 sons from his wives Rachel, Lea and their concubines.

Pix: After wrestling with an angel and having his name changed to Israel, these 12 sons Jacob became the 12 tribes of Israel.

Though God was faithful these people of the promise they were not. For example 10 of Jacob's sons sold their own brother daddy's favorite into slavery. A terrible thing, but God who is

faithful turned lemons into lemon aide.
