PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"To Pray is to Laugh, Whistle – DANCE on happy feet Sing! **SHOUT** and jump! higher than ever before.

But it is also to whisper – Wonder...

Stumble in dark places. Gry... SCREAM

or just hold a tired head in tired hands and wait...

PRAYER is our tired reaching out to the ONE who holds us closer and loves us more than we would dare imagine." − Greta Schrumm

Last spring, as I walked through a very muddy Lake Ripley Cemetery to do the graveside service of a sister in Christ who had died of cancer at age 79... I overheard Bella, a six year old and family member, ask her big sister, "Why do people have to die at all? Why is there death?" At which point the very smart 8th grade big sis, saw me behind them and said – that's a great question... for Pastor Christa. (ha, ha :-)). Well – little Bella asked me the question, too, and I responded... "That's a great question, Bella --- a great question we should ask God..."

Now, we didn't leave it just at that. We talked more, but isn't that just like a Kindergartner? She asked the very things we as adults often feel the world has taught us NOT to ask anymore --- even when those same questions are at the heart of life for us. It's precisely for these and all other questions and doubts that I thank God for the disciple Thomas --- a disciple I relate to quite often.

You see... Immediately following Jesus' resurrection at the tomb that first Easter, Jesus spoke with Mary and then went to speak with the disciples, hiding, scared, terrified that they, too, would be caught like Jesus. Amazingly, Jesus shows up to them in the upper room. He comes and says, "Peace be with you!" Then he tells them, "Do not be afraid." They are all amazed and rejoice in the good news that Jesus truly is alive! God has done it --- he has defeated the power of death! With the resurrection --- there is hope and new life again!

Yes! – but Thomas missed it. Perhaps he was out getting groceries or food, who knows, but Thomas missed Jesus. So, when they told him the resurrection good news --- he doubted that it was true. Thomas forever carries the weight of being the one who doubted.

Yet, are we all that different from Thomas? Many of us have our doubts, too. How does prayer work? How does God work? Where is God when there is suffering and pain? How does God hear and answer every prayer — especially when my prayer isn't answered the way I need and want it to? God, where are you when my loved one is suffering? God, where are you --- I need you? & like little Bella, why is there death?

Thomas' doubts are not so unusual. He wanted to see and touch Jesus' wounds. But in reality, it was not the seeing and touching that caused Thomas to proclaim, "My Lord and my God." It was the presence of the One whom his grief and sorrow believed was gone forever. It was the love and grace from the One whom he dared not even hope was alive, for fear of what the disappointment would be if it was not true.

It was the reality of the Living God of this world that helped him believe, not the wounds in Jesus' hands, feet, or side --- but the love and new life of Jesus Christ himself. The presence of the One who loved him with a love that would NEVER let



him go. The cross, separation, loneliness, even death --- nothing could separate Christ from him --- that was the resurrection good news that renewed Thomas.

Jesus meets Thomas and all his doubts --- with love, forgiveness, and grace. Jesus does not chastise Thomas for doubting, he simply meets his doubts and brings the Living God into them – and then blesses those who believe without seeing.

How about you? Is it possible that Jesus hears your doubts, as well -- -and then rushes to -You?

God hears your questions about how prayer works, and the Living God of this world shows up to bring you himself when you pray. When you are scared, lonely, angry, or full of sorrow --- the Living God hears you and COMES. The Living God comes into your home, your workplace, your very life and the presence of the Risen Christ meets your doubts and questions with His love, mercy, and grace.

God's knowledge and pain of the cross ---- understands your doubts, questions, fears, worries, and sorrows better than even you do. The God of the cross meets you in your doubts --- and then brings the surprising good news of the empty tomb. God who knows suffering and pain meets your pain and questioning with His love and comfort, strength and hope. Then He raises you from death to new life.

In light of the good news that Christ is risen, I told Bella that I thought God asked the same question and felt the same way. God doesn't like death anymore than we do --- and that's precisely why he destroys it. That's exactly why there is Easter. Pain, sorrow, sin, injuries, cancer, suffering --- even death --- God destroyed and still destroys them all through the Risen, Living Jesus Christ, who meets us here and now in our doubts and in our faith...

This month – we journey to the good news of the cross and empty tomb and prepare to proclaim and shout: "Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed!" May we cling to the resurrection good news, as God meets each of us in our joys and challenges and in our faith and in our doubts. May God rush in to uplift us and carry us, so we too might proclaim, "My Lord and My God!"

FROM OUR MISSIONARIES

February 27, 2014

Dear Friends and Supporters:

Grace and Peace to you all in the name of Christ. In this newsletter we would like to share with you the background of one of our newest pastors with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Japan (JELC). His name is Rev. Yoshihiko Ito. He was ordained in March of 2013 and has been serving as the sole pastor in our Lutheran church in Hiroshima.

Before introducing him we would like you to know that we will once again be in the States this coming summer. Hopefully in just another day or two we will get a letter off to you all to let you know details of that.

REV.YOSHIHIKO ITO (We will call him Yoshi for short)

Yoshi is currently 48 years old and he came to the seminary 5 years ago to begin his theological education and then to start his second career as a pastor. He grew up in a Christian home and his family participated in worship at an independent church with no affiliation with a particular denomination. He has three younger sisters. At age 18 he expressed his faith in Christ and was baptized.

He went to a university that specialized in electronics and upon finishing up his education he was hired by Sony and worked there for twenty-four years. At the age of 21 he had a good friend who committed suicide and that had a very big influence over him. He thought about that for a long time. As a Christian he realized he had the gift of faith that brought along a sense of hope. That was something his friend never had. The suicide experience got him started thinking about the possibility of being an evangelist. However he continued to work at Sony.

When Yoshi was 27 he met his wife in Korea and they got married. Her family was also Christian, so they were able to share their faith within the marriage. Since they were unable to have children they adopted their daughter who is now 14 years old. Adoption is still relatively rare in Japan. In his 30s Yoshi took a correspondence course about Christianity and the desire to become either an evangelist or a pastor grew stronger. He learned many things and discovered that both Luther and Calvin and their thinking really fit him. At age 44 he felt the call from God to pursue his dream of being a pastor and entered the Japan Lutheran Theological Seminary where Jim teaches. In 2013 he was ordained and is now serving the Lutheran Church in Hiroshima. The church has a home page (in Japanese) if

Hiroshima church is one of our larger and stronger churches here in Japan. Not only was Yoshi a very good student, but he is doing excellent work now as a pastor. Please remember Rev. Yoshihiko Ito, his family and his church in Hiroshima.

In the fall Jim was asked to go preach and give a lecture about spirituality at his church.
