

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Turning our "NOT YET..." into "NOW..."

In the sixth chapter of the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus says, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? 26 Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? 27Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?"

My heart is a little unsettled this month – my baby, Jennica – starts preschool in a month, and is it possible that my oldest, Marcus, is old enough to start second grade in a month? Can't be! As my husband, Jon, says --- we don't have any babies any more. True, but in many ways it doesn't matter how old our children get, they are always our babies.

So, as the summer has flown by, I've found myself thinking... "Not yet..." Not, yet, I'm not ready for June to be done. Not yet, I'm not ready for vacation to be over. Not yet, where did July go? Not yet, is it really August already? Not yet, how can it already be Fair time? Not yet, is it really time to be shopping for school supplies? Not yet, God — I'm not ready for my babies to be growing up.

Now, intellectually, I recognize that my son and daughter are ready for these next steps and can't wait. It is exactly what they need, and they will thrive. In that sense, I am excited and overjoyed for them. But, it's my heart that looks and says --- their time is no longer mine

anymore. Once school starts, they continue on that road to growing up. Sure, he will thrive and learn and grow --- all things parents desire for their children. But, it also means — they will grow up and as they mature and grow up, we prepare them to spread their wings and fly. Which means, they leave the nest.

Now, there may be many of you (like my husband) who are smiling or laughing right now at a mom who is over-reacting or a little too sentimental. Which may very well be true. However, we all do this in one way or another. Whether every year, we say "not yet" to the approach of Christmas. Not yet to a child who is actually heading off to college, the military or a new job. Not yet to taxes due. Not yet to a health problem. Not yet to a fracture or stress in your relationship with a loved one. Not yet to a work project that has to be finished now. Not yet to the failing health of a loved one. NOT YET. We all think it or say it at one time or another.

So, how about you? In what ways are you saying, "Not yet..."? In what ways do you feel time is not on your side, and you are whispering or yelling "not yet," at your life circumstances or a relationship? In what way might you be saying, "not yet" to God?

And then... it happens. God's grace rushes in and you meet a God who NEVER SAYS, "NOT YET," TO YOU. God in Christ Jesus meets you and takes you just as you are. The Living God of

Group 4 is still on to help keep the kitchen sparkle, We hope we can trust people to help out in whatever way they can. Thanks.



LWR SCHOOL KITS



Time to start thinking about back to school! Immanuel will be collecting items to make School Kits to donate to Lutheran World Relief. Our Sunday School students will be assembling the kits in September, but with many families beginning to purchase supplies now, we wanted to get the information out so many of you can purchase extra supplies while they are readily available and often times sale-priced.

Why school supplies? To the children who receive School Kits, these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not. Public school is usually free, but in the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can

afford. And when parents can only afford to send one of their children to school, girls rarely get priority...yet the education level of mothers has the biggest impact on development.

Here are a few guidelines for donating:

- -Please give new items only, except where otherwise noted
- -Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your congregation's name
- -Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage

Detailed lists of needed supplies are available at church, or go to http://lwr.org/getinvolved/schoolkits. For anyone who enjoys sewing, there is a pattern available for the drawstring backpacks that are on the supply list.

This is a great service project for the whole family...we hope everyone at Immanuel will get involved! Our goal is to provide 50 kits, which is approximately the number of Sunday School children we have in grades K-6.

Here is the list of supplies needed for the kits:

Four 70-sheet notebooks (280-300 sheets total) of wide or college-ruled paper (no loose-leaf paper)

One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

One pencil sharpener
One pair of blunt scissors
Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
One box of 16 or 24 crayons
One 2-1/2" eraser

\$2.50 to help cover the cost of the backpacks (Immanuel will be purchasing the backpacks in bulk)
