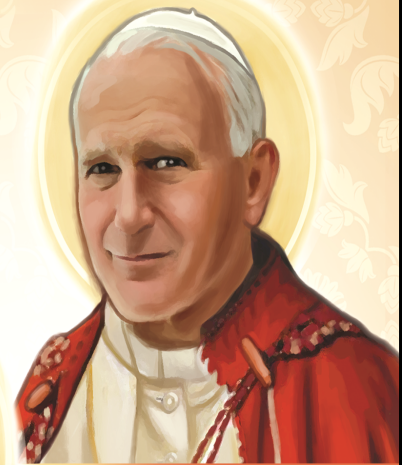

Congratulations to our First Communicants this weekend and next, and to those of the many other parishes celebrating in these weekends.

Long the final of the three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist), it is still the final one given at the Easter Vigil. Until about 100 years ago, it was usually received around the age of 14, sometime after Confirmation. Some of you may remember receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation in 3rd or 4th grade, and then, at least in some places, such as Vermillion, having "Solemn First Communion" around the age of 14. This was a throwback to the days when everyone received Communion later.

St. Pius X, when Pope from 1903-1914, decided to change the age of reception of Communion to the "age of reason" which he set at age 7 or so. That is how almost everyone in memory now started receiving in 2nd grade (although the first parish I was assigned to did it in 3rd grade.) Our candidates have been studying hard, have had their first, and in most cases, at least a second confession in preparation. We are proud of them! I hope they remember it for the rest of their lives, and have their second Communion in the next week.

On a personal note, this Saturday, April 26 is my 50th anniversary of receiving Holy Communion for the first time. I'm estimating having received it some 13,000 to 14,000 times since then. Next week, May 3rd, is my 50th anniversary since the first time I served Mass – on my parents' 15th wedding anniversary.

After significant thought and discussion, I've decided to move our Mass schedule to a rotating, 3 Mass weekend, with one Mass in each parish. We will start this on Pentecost, the weekend of June 7-8. We will advertise this, and send letters to everyone, but here is how it will go:

There will be three seasons: Summer, from the Sunday after Memorial Day through Labor Day weekend. Fall, from the Sunday after Labor Day through December 31st. Spring, from January 1 through Memorial Day weekend. The schedule will be:

Summer: St. John the Baptist, 5:00 on Saturday evening; St. Mary's, 8:00 am on Sunday, and St. Mathias, 10:00 am on Sunday.

Fall: St. Mathias at 5:00 pm on Saturday; St. Mary at 8:00 am on Sunday, and St. John the Baptist at 10:00 am on Sunday.

Spring: St. Mary at 5:00 pm on Saturday; St. Mathias at 8:00 am on Sunday, and St. John the Baptist at 10:00 am on Sunday.

Some Rationale:

- We need a Sunday morning Mass in Hampton at a time when many people will want to attend Mass, which seems to be no earlier than 8:00 am and no later than 10:00 am. Without that these past five years, there has been an erosion in sense of community there. The current Mass times there are not conducive to creating community.
- The 10:00 Mass in Vermillion during the school year allows them to keep their Sunday morning Faith Formation program, and allows the pastor to visit it.
- 8:00 am the majority of the years lets New Trier maintain the community that has settled around that time and place.
- Rotating the Saturday evening lets the Saturday evening



people, who are most loyal to their time, to be in their home parish at least sometimes.

- Summer Mass at 10:00 in Hampton allows use of their air conditioning during some warmer Masses, and fits in with their festival. If the Saturday evening Mass in Vermillion is too warm some weekend, we can determine that ahead of time, and have Mass in the air-conditioned Community Room of the school.
- Two Masses on Sunday morning makes a much saner schedule for the pastor, both now and for whoever in the future. This allows longer time to meet with people after Mass, attend coffee and donuts, at least stop in at graduation Mass receptions (which can't happen for me this year), lets us start Mass on time on Palm Sunday or other extraordinary days; allows the priest to stop in at Faith Formation in Vermillion on Sundays, something I haven't been able to do at all.

All this will take some cooperation, and will also require an expanded list of ministers for liturgies: we will need new people for lectors, ushers, extraordinary Eucharistic ministers; I will want each parish to have a program for small children at Masses; we should also ramp up our hospitality or create ways of building community around Mass time in all cases. It is an opportunity for growth. Will it be confusing to visitors? Probably; we will update the information on masstime.org. We will have to update signs. We will need your cooperation, but here are really only three dates to remember: Labor Day, New Year's Day, and Memorial Day. Will people go elsewhere because "their" Mass time has been changed 30 minutes or to Saturday evening for part of the year? Maybe. But if where they hope family members will be married or buried is important to them, I think that can be overcome in their hearts. Holy Days, Ash Wednesday, Triduum, etc. will still be determined as usual, and each parish will have a Mass Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. We will talk about confession schedules soon.

In the GROW survey, some people asked about a later Mass on Saturday evening. I know those working at the refinery often have to work from 6:00 am to 6:00 pm, and some farmers would prefer to work later on Saturdays. I have some sympathy for all this. If people can convince me that there is field work they can stop doing at 6:30 on Saturday that they can't stop doing at 8:00 am or 10:00 am on Sunday morning, I'd like to know what it is. During harvest time, or turnaround, if there is enough interest in a later Saturday Mass, say 8:00 or 9:00 p.m., I'd be willing to listen, if we can do Mass in a proper way, e.g. with music, ministers, etc.

As you heard in the news, the deposition of Archbishop Nienstedt in a case from 1974 (when he was still in Michigan) has been released. You can find the entire transcript and video on the Archdiocesan website, www.archspm.org. The Catholic Spirit will also have an article on it in the current or coming issue. Please read it. I trust it will give a fuller account than what is seen on TV or heard on radio, or even in the regular newspapers. As always, please pray for those who have been abused. Many priests are incorporating times of prayer and fasting into their weeks for that purpose.

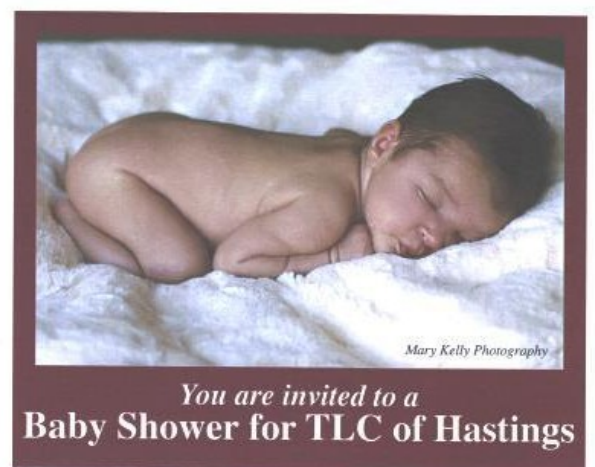


May Family Rosary Procession – Sunday May 4

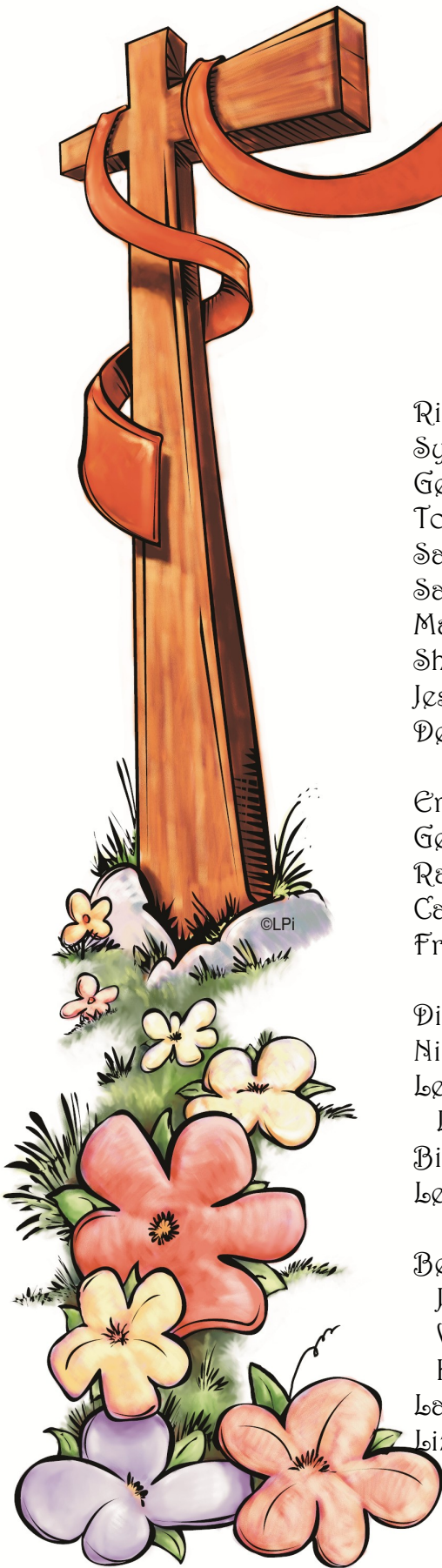

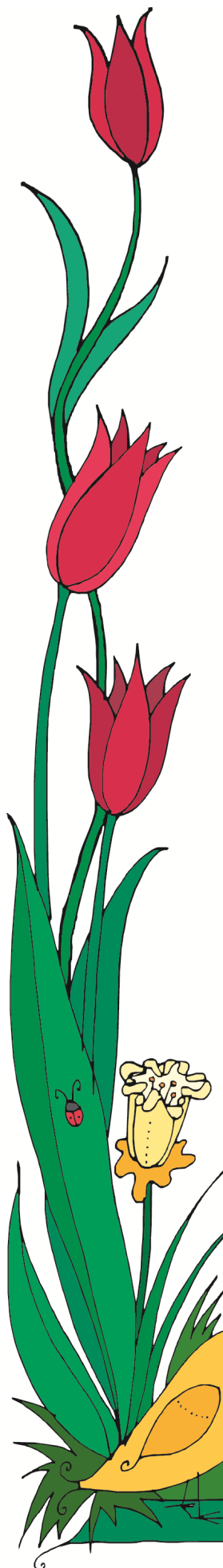

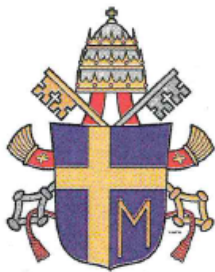

SAINT JOHN PAUL II

Saint John Paul II was born Karol Józef Wojtyła on May 18, 1920 in the Polish town of Wadowice. He attended Krakow's Jagiellonian University in 1938 before Nazi occupation forces closed it in 1939.

He began seminary in 1942, continued his studies after the war, and was ordained as a priest by Archbishop Sapeiha in Krakow in November of 1946. He was then sent to Rome, finished his doctorate in theology two years later, and returned to Poland.

In Poland, he served as the vicar to numerous parishes, became a professor of moral theology and social ethics, and was appointed titular bishop of Ombi and auxiliary bishop of Krakow in 1958. He was appointed archbishop of Krakow in 1964, made a cardinal in 1967, and took part in Vatican Council II.



The Cardinals elected him as Pope on October 16, 1978 and he took the name of John Paul II. His papacy lasted nearly 27 years, comprised of more pastoral visits, meetings with the people of God, and audiences with world leaders than any of his predecessors, and authored dozens of encyclicals, exhortations, constitutions, and letters.

Pope John Paul II also established World Youth Days, encouraged dialogue with members of other religions, and tirelessly promoted the spiritual renewal of the church until the end of his life. He died on April 2, 2005. Between his day of death and funeral on April 8, more than three million pilgrims came to Rome to pay homage.

SAINT JOHN XXIII

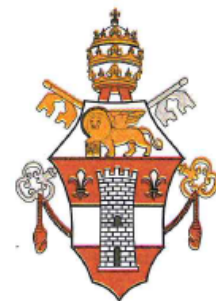
Saint John XXIII was born Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli on November 25, 1881, in Monte, Italy. He entered the Bergamo seminary in 1892 and was admitted to the Secular Franciscan Order in 1896.

He continued his studies at the Pontifical Roman Seminary in 1901, was ordained in Rome in 1904, and was appointed secretary to the new Bishop of Bergamo a year later, a position he held until the bishop's death in 1914.

In 1921 he was brought to Rome by Benedict XV to be Italian president of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. He was named Apostolic Visitor in Bulgaria four years later and ordained as bishop. In 1935 he was named Apostolic Delegate in Turkey and Greece.

During World War II, he helped many Jews escape from Greece and aided numerous prisoners of war. After the war, he lived a life striving for Gospel simplicity and was a living example of prayer, pastoral care, and trust in the Lord.

The cardinals elected him Pope on October 28, 1958, and he took the name of John XXIII. Although his papacy—defined by his meek, gentle, simple, and courageous spirit—lasted less than five years, his decision to summon the Second Vatican Council launched an extensive renewal of the Church still felt fifty years later. He died on June 3, 1963.

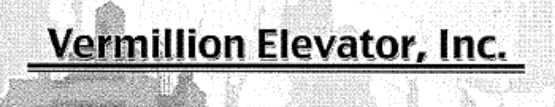

Clem and Imelda are on the left and Imelda's sister, Veronica and her husband Paul Meyer are on the right. This fall they will be married 65 years.

Imelda was born and raised in the Hampton area, the daughter of John and Rose Becker. Her grandmother owned the N.P. Gores store where Imelda worked as a young girl. She was one of ten children.

Clem was born in Dundas, the middle child in a family of four boys and three girls. He worked on his family farm and also at the Faribault Cheese Factory before joining the Army Air Corps during WW II. He served from 1942-46 as an airplane mechanic, starting with a single-engine plane, the AT-6. He also worked on 4-engine planes, the B-17's, B-24's, B-32's and B-29's.


He and Imelda were married after he returned from war and purchased a farm in Dundas, living there for eight years. In 1957 they bought a farm east of Hampton and raised hogs and milked Jersey cows, besides farming the land.

Clem retired from farming in 1992 and they moved to Farmington. Their son, Randy, took over on the farm, but Clem still raises his home-grown popcorn on the land.
