



FROM FATHER STAN

This weekend we experience the summer solstice, that is, the longest days of the year, when the earth is tilted in such a way that the sun appears to rise and set furthest to the north. The days will start to grow shorter after this, until those days just before Christmas when the night is the longest and the sun rises and sets furthest to the south



making for a much shorter arc through the sky. Among pagans this is a big thing, and there are theories that places such as Stonehenge in England acted as a solar calendar in this way. Catholics are not pagan, and we understand everything to be under God's control. But there are some ways such events of nature instruct our understanding of our relationship to God. One such example is during this week when we celebrate the birth of John the Baptist. John was six months older than Jesus (Luke 1), and we celebrate Jesus' birthday on December 25, when the days are starting to get longer – more light in the world. John's birthday is celebrated on June 24th, when days are getting shorter. What did John say of himself in relationship to Jesus? "He must increase while I decrease." (John 3:30). John understood his was role to point out Jesus, and that was his high point in life. As a true disciple, he did his work, served his God, and did not ask for the glory to be his. What we do should be to point to the light of the world, Jesus Christ.

As part of GROW (the pastoral planning process each of our three parishes have been involved with) and even before then, we saw a need for Stewardship and Hospitality committees in each parish. What would they do?

A Stewardship committee would help develop a sense of stewardship in the daily life of a parish and its parishioners. How do we receive God's gifts gratefully? How do we develop our gifts? How do we share them? How do we return them to God? There are different areas of stewardship: stewardship of creation – how do we respect life, protect our land and environment, and advance the world through our labor? Stewardship of vocation – how do we carry out God's unique and individual role as a disciple? How do we know what God wants us to do? Stewardship of the Church – we need to share our time, talent and treasure to fulfill the mission of the parish, diocese and universal Church. What would this mean for outreach, a sister parish, addressing needs in the parish area? A stewardship committee would likely meet four times a year to develop bulletin blurbs, perhaps plan how a ministry fair or workshop on financial planning or wills would be written (and perhaps include the parish for a fraction of the estate in planned giving.)

A Hospitality Committee would try to create a greater awareness of hospitality among parish members. How do we create a place where one can be most open to the Holy Spirit working in their lives? Where do they feel most free to enter into the work of the parish, where they can become

the best version of themselves, as Matthew Kelly would put it. At one level this is greeting people as they come into church, and introducing yourself to someone you don't know – making the person feel welcome, as a member, not feeling like an intruder. It can also be, as we are doing in some places, a group that prepares cards to be sent to people, especially teenagers, on their birthday. It is inviting people into leadership in the parish, listening to their ideas in our committees and planning sessions, being present to mourners at funerals, establishing mentor programs for new members or new families in schools, welcome dinners with the pastor. Some of this happens naturally in our parishes, and some of it does not. Sometimes we only get one shot at welcoming someone, so we need to be intentional about it.

Vacation Bible School will be held at St. John the Baptist School this coming week.

Thank you to Fr. Frank Fried who is covering the Saturday evening Mass in Vermillion for me this Saturday while I am with my siblings for part of the weekend. Fr. Fried is recently retired, and a member of my priest support group.

There will be some other times this summer when I will be away from the parish, such as from noon Tuesday until Thursday night this week, on a mini-vacation, with the youth on the Mission Trip from July 5-12, with my priest support group July 21-23, and perhaps a few days in the middle of a week in August. In addition, as dean, I will be installing new pastors in our deanery. This year that will mean installing Fr. David Hennen as pastor of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in Hastings, and whoever will be assigned to the parishes in Miesville and Cannon Falls. Please keep our neighboring parishes in prayer during this time of transition, saying good bye to one pastor and hello to another.

A number of people have asked me how long I will be pastor here. The answer is one never knows. July 3 I complete five years as pastor. My assignment letter said six years, extendable to up to twelve years. Each year we are sent a survey as to what our hopes and plans are. I've expressed that I would like to be here about a total of nine years – I think there are projects and programs to do to keep me busy and active for at least that long, and the parishes would be better set up for one priest to effectively administer them. That would make me 62 years old, and I'd rather not be much older than that when I take on what I hope will be my final parish assignment. If my health is good, I'd like to remain in full-time ministry until age 72, and then taper off.







St. John the Baptist Parish Vermillion

Work will be done in plaster repair and painting in the sanctuary area (altar area) between June 30 and July 4. We are also deciding whether to do additional painting and repair work on the plaster and painting on the east and west walls of the church in some or all of the arches throughout the church. The budget for next year was approved by the parish council at our meeting Tuesday night. It shows a small deficit, but we hope to make that up, as we did this year. We have also decided to create an agency fund for the school, administered by the Catholic Community Foundation. We will use the money from the grant given by a non-parishioner last year, which you matched with

donations last fall, along with three small CDs that were designated for the school. This will total something just over \$50,000. An agency fund is like an endowment, but the parish retains control over the money, able to take the principal out at any time. Because of this, it is invested quite conservatively and will grow more slowly. We can review this in a few years, and if we are comfortable with not needing the money in the foreseeable future, create an endowment to serve the school even better. In the meantime, this will mean we need a bit less of the parish operating funds for the school. Each year 4% of the fund will be withdrawn, and any additional earnings will augment the fund. It is a small start to something that will help ensure the future of the school.


